


RABI ISLAND – FIJI THE "FORGOTTEN PEOPLE"


The people on Rabi Island are called the "Forgotten people". The people were moved from Ocean Island when the phosphate ran out after World War Two. Over the past 5 years Sr Terita has done an outstanding job working with the community to assess the needs. Through funding from OLSH Overseas Aid, the community has benefited in several ways including the purchase of boats for access to remote areas, water tanks for fresh drinking water and also the establishment of some small businesses

to support local micro business initiatives. This includes a piggery and hand crafts by local women. In recent times the Island has been impacted by severe weather incidents, including the recent Cyclone (Winston). OLSH Overseas Aid has increased funding for these "forgotten people" by providing raw materials to develop cyclone shelters, storage and meeting areas for the communities for protection against future weather events.

Sadly though Mapuordit is increasingly surrounded by the horrors of starvation, the gross injustices to the poor, the racial hatred and inter-tribal conflicts, not to mention the gross corruption and continued large scale purchasing of military equipment...all in the face of thousands of innocent people starving

generosity have enabled us to continue country broken to pieces...as many pieces

Around Mapuordit we see much hunger, in some cases quite severe, but through your generous support at this stage we continue to be able to provide food to those in need.

Currently we have two men in Agriculture training, unfortunately not in South Sudan, due to "ethnic cleansing" but in Equatoria, the food basket of South Sudan. They are now in Uganda and when finished will bring home their knowledge and skills to our community

With an aim to support this programme further and avoid hunger across South Sudan, the Sister's have initiated the South Sudan 2017 Hunger Appeal – where we hope to raise much needed funds to continue the good work currently being conducted in the region.

Mapuordit Hospital (South Sudan) - an update from Pauline Carr

For so many years now, our Hospital in Mapuordit, South Sudan, has been the grateful recipient of funding through Overseas Aid. We would like to give an update.

As most people would know, this is a country with a very deeply troubled history of almost constant war and tribal conflict, the result being that development has been very much retarded. The hospital was started by Comboni missionaries in 2002, under a mandate of the Diocese of Rumbek. In the intervening years, it has grown to a rather remarkable 113 beds, offering health care to the people of the catchment and far beyond. The estimate of the catchment population is around 90,000.

Although there is a small offering of support from the Ministry of Health, in terms of salary support to 44 staff, the remaining 32 local staff are supported by private contracts, from donor funds. The government salary is totally unrealistic, given the current state of high inflation in the country, and so the hospital is obliged to ask donors to "top up" the salaries to a level where staff are motivated to stay and work, so as to feed, clothe and educate their families. Without the support of Overseas Aid and other generous donors from every corner of the globe, our hospital would simply not be able to function.

On behalf of those many, many people who would never be able to reach out and thank those who are so generously supporting them, we say a heartfelt


